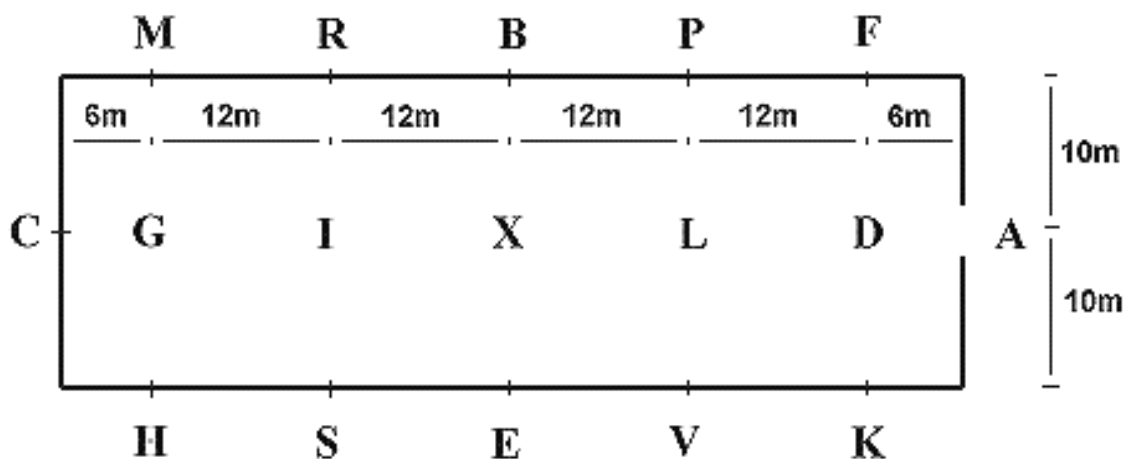
GLASS-ED Mission Statement

The Great Lakes Area Show Series-Educational Dressage, Inc. (GLASS-ED) is a non-profit corporation, dedicated to the promotion and encouragement of the sport of Dressage. GLASS-ED is open to all enthusiasts of Dressage, all breeds of horses, all riding levels, professional or amateur, so as to encourage the progressive training of the horse and the rider that defines dressage. Our emphasis is to provide an enjoyable, safe, educational, competitive dressage experience for both new and experienced horse/rider teams creating and encouraging a positive environment for competitive excellence in the future.

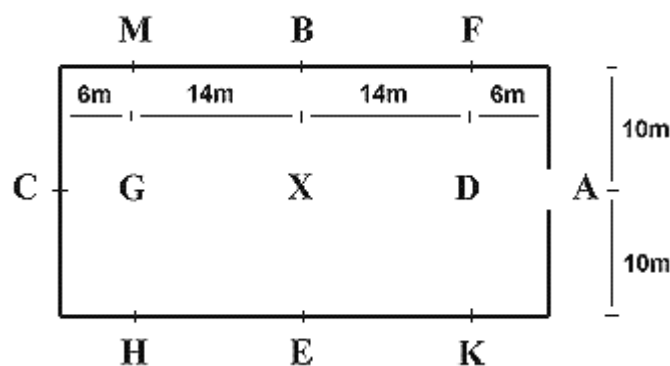
Toward this end, GLASS-ED will organize and sanction dressage competitions in the State of Michigan, with certification of compliance to USEF/USEA rules, except as modified by GLASS-ED, including appropriate records reflecting the same.

Warm-Up Arena Etiquette

- Pass left shoulder to left shoulder.
- When walking, stay well to the inside of the track, so that those who are working may make use of it. Also, if you are going to halt, rein-back, etc., either come in off track or do it on the short ends of the arena.
- Lateral movements (especially the shoulder-in and the haunches-in, which usually are done along the wall) have the right of way.
- Do NOT cut someone off.
- Look where you are going and where others are going.
- If you notice that someone is not looking where they are going, say in a LOUD voice, "HEADS UP!"
- If you should lose control of your horse, warn others by saying in a LOUD voice, "HEADS UP!"
- Lunging a horse in the Warm-Up arena at a competition is not allowed. Find out where lunging is permitted. It is also not a good idea to lunge in an arena where other people are riding as it often is very dangerous (and selfish, since it takes up an enormous amount of space!).
- Remember – be polite and forgiving – we all make mistakes.

2024 GLASS-ED Rules Overview

Complete rules for GLASS-ED, forms for show entry, membership, year end awards, musical rides, year end award point standings, and more are located at www.glass-ed.com. **It is your responsibility to read the entire rule book. This is just a high level overview of key points. In case of information conflicts, the rule book is the official documentation.**

Participation

Maximum Ride Limit: A horse at Introductory Level ONLY, may enter a maximum of six classes per day. Horses entered at Training Level or above may enter a maximum of four classes per day.

Helmets: ASTM/SEI equestrian protective headgear must be worn by anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Attire: USEF rules for attire apply (DR120 and WD122). However, paddock boots with half chaps of a conservative color are allowed for Introductory through Fourth Level.

Junior, Young Rider, and Adult Status: Individuals are eligible as Junior/Young Riders until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22.

Professional Status: Any person who trains horses or riders for recompense, monetary or otherwise within one year of the show entered, shall be considered to be a professional for purposes of GLASS-ED shows. Professional riders may not enter Walk-Trot Equitation. Professional riders may only enter classes designated as “open.”

Walk Trot Equitation: Walk-Trot Equitation classes are open to any rider showing in only Introductory Level or walk-trot classes. Professional riders are prohibited from the class and riders who have entered Training Level or higher classes in the same show are prohibited from entering walk-trot equitation.

Judges: Riders who have taken a lesson or purchased a horse from a judge within the 30-day period preceding that show may only ride hors concours under that judge.

Conduct and Requirements for Competition Management

Leadline Classes: Leadline classes are limited to riders age 7 and under; riders entering leadline classes are prohibited from entering any other class at that show. All leadline entries require a leader to be registered on the on the entry form. All leaders must be over the age of 18 and will be responsible for the safety of the horse and rider.

Year-End Awards

Registration To be eligible for GLASS-ED Year End Awards, the rider must be a GLASS-ED member, the horse must be registered with GLASS-ED and the rider/horse team must have participated in at least three (3) GLASS-ED shows.

Point Accumulation: Begins on the date the Membership and Horse Registration forms and all fees are received by GLASS-ED or a GLASS-ED show host and ends at the last show of the GLASS-ED season.

Qualifying: A registrant shall be deemed qualified in a category, if the registrant/horse have ridden in at least one (1) class in a category in at least three (3) different GLASS-ED shows since registering for that season. In addition, least one (1) of the tests ridden in this award must have a minimum score of, at least, 55% to qualify for a high percentage year end award.

(NEW IN 2023) High Percentage Championship: High percentage championship is awarded to the competitor with the highest average percentage of all scores received in their division.

Test of Choice: Scores from Test of Choice (TOC) classes will count toward Breed Awards and Certificates of Achievement. Refer to full rules for details on TOC classes.

Point System: The point system for calculating rider and breed GLASS-ED Year End Awards is shown below

If only Open level classes are offered at a show and a rider is registered for Junior/Young Rider or Adult Amateur year end award categories, placing points will accumulate for the year end award category for which the rider is registered. However, if Junior/Young Rider or Adult Amateur divisions are offered as separate classes, rides in Open classes will not count toward Junior/Young Rider or Adult Amateur year end award categories.

Placings awarded at recognized USDF dressage shows may be used for the GLASS-ED category USDF Open – All Levels year end award high point accumulation, and placings awarded at recognized USDF events may be used for the GLASS-ED category USDF Open. Send rider and horse placing within fourteen (14) days after completion of the competition to the GLASS-ED Point Keeper at points@glass-ed.org. Include the internet address of show results for verification of placing.

USEA Year End award uses the points and scores for riders entered in USEA tests at GLASS-ED shows.

Classic Saddlery High Percentage Qualifier Award

Each ride earning the minimum score listed below will automatically enter the rider into a drawing for one of two \$100 gift certificates to Classic Saddlery. Virtual Show scores do not count toward this award.

Class Fees: \$25 per class entries. Make checks payable to Aberdeen Farm LLC. Mailed entry forms must be sent with a copy of current coggins (needed only once for the series), signed entry agreement (needed only once for the series), and check. Mailed entries must be received 14 days prior to the show. Online entries must be received 10 days prior to the show. Enter online at www.eqentries.com. Entries received after the closing date will only be accepted online and if there is available space. A \$15 post entry fee will apply. No entry will be accepted without a negative coggins, signature, and full payment.

Stabling: Stalls are \$60.00 per show. Shavings are available for purchase at \$9.00 per bag if preordered or \$10 at the show. No hay or grain will be available. Stalls will be assigned on a first requested, first pay basis. Stalls will be available at 1PM on the day prior to the show.

Haul In: All horses showing from trailers will be charged a \$35 per day haul in fee. Haul in availability will be at the show managers discretion.

Non-Showing Horses: Non-showing horses are \$40 per show with stabling preference given to competitors.

Refunds: There will be no refunds for any reason after the closing date. Before closing date, full refunds minus the \$30 office fee.

Dogs: All dogs must be on a 6ft or shorter leash and attached to a responsible person at all times.

Awards: Ribbons 1st-6th place and Champion and Reserve for high percentage test in each level with at least 3 entries awarded at the end of each day. Series Grand and Reserve Championships will be presented at the conclusion of the season so long as at least 9 shows are able to run. Year-end awards are determined by averaging the 2 highest tests (from 2 different shows) from each horse/rider combo who attended at least 4 shows.

Dressage Tests: The 2023 USEF/USDF dressage tests, 2022 western dressage tests, and IEO lead line dressage tests will be used. All tests may be read. Horse/Rider combinations may show in only 2 consecutive levels. IEO lead line tests can be found at www.aberdeenfarm.weebly.com/shows.

Combining/Splitting of Tests/Classes: Tests may be combined if there are less than 3 entries. Tests may be split if there are more than 12 entries or at management's discretion. If you do not indicate your level on your entry form you will automatically be entered as open.

Divisions: Novice Rider- any rider in their 1st or 2nd year of showing dressage at any venue. Novice Horse- any horse in its 1st or 2nd year of showing with any rider at any venue. Junior – a rider who was less than 21 years of age on January 1st of the current year. Adult Amateur - a rider who is age 21 or over. Open – professional of any age. Please be sure to indicate your rider status on your entry form so that you are placed in the correct division. If you do not indicate your level on your entry form you will automatically be entered as open.

Headgear: DR 120.6. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted

Attire: Riders may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120.8. Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in DR120.1-6. Ride

Times: Ride times will be available the Thursday prior to the show. Ride time requests will only be honored if they do not disadvantage other riders. After ride times are posted, any open times due to scratches will be posted in the show office. Times will be posted on www.aberdeenfarm.weebly.com/shows. For questions about ride times, please email donna@aberdeenfarm.com.

Judges: If for any reason you cannot show under a particular judge (trainer, coach, etc.) you must notify us in writing on your entry form. No refunds will be considered if we are not notified on your entry form.

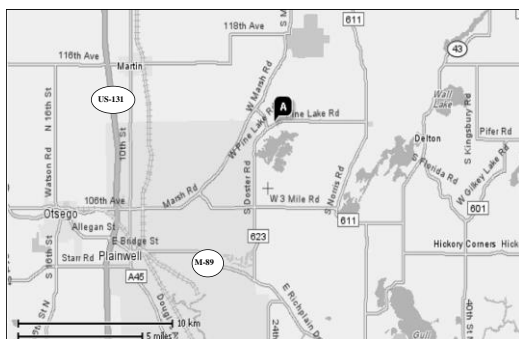

Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted

Attire: Riders may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120.8. Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in DR120.1-6. Ride

Times: Ride times will be available the Thursday prior to the show. Ride time requests will only be honored if they do not disadvantage other riders. Dogs: All dogs must be on a 6ft or shorter leash and attached to a responsible person at all times.

Awards: Ribbons 1st-6th place and Champion and Reserve for high percentage test in each level with at least 3 entries awarded at the end of each day. Series Grand and Reserve Championships will be presented at the conclusion of the season so long as at least 9 shows are able to run. Year-end awards are determined by averaging the 2 highest tests (from 2 different shows) from each horse/rider combo who attended at least 4 shows.

Dressage Tests: The 2023 USEF/USDF dressage tests, 2022 western dressage tests, and IEO lead line dressage tests will be used. All tests may be read. Horse/Rider combinations may show in only 2 consecutive levels. IEO lead line tests can be found at www.aberdeenfarm.weebly.com/shows.

Combining/Splitting of Tests/Classes: Tests may be combined if there are less than 3 entries. Tests may be split if there are more than 12 entries or at management's discretion. If you do not indicate your level on your entry form you will automatically be entered as open.

Divisions: Novice Rider- any rider in their 1st or 2nd year of showing dressage at any venue. Novice Horse- any horse in its 1st or 2nd year of showing with any rider at any venue. Junior – a rider who was less than 21 years of age on January 1st of the current year. Adult Amateur - a rider who is age 21 or over. Open – professional of any age. Please be sure to indicate your rider status on your entry form so that you are placed in the correct division. If you do not indicate your level on your entry form you will automatically be entered as open.

Headgear: DR 120.6. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted

Attire: Riders may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120.8. Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in DR120.1-6. Ride

Times: Ride times will be available the Thursday prior to the show. Ride time requests will only be honored if they do not disadvantage other riders. After ride times are posted, any open times due to scratches will be posted in the show office. Times will be posted on www.aberdeenfarm.weebly.com/shows.
